What is a Road Rally? Bring any road-legal vehicle, a friend, and come have some fun on a Time-Speed-Distance (TSD) Road Rally! This is NOT a race. The challenge for the driver and navigator is to follow directions and to attempt to precisely maintain an assigned average speed. You will encounter checkpoints along the route where your arrival time will be recorded. Arrive early (too fast) or late (too slow) and you will collect penalty points. Lowest score at the end of the rally wins. This event is safe and legal; all speeds are within the posted limits.

Why do I want to run a Road Rally? A road rally might be for you if you like to drive on back country roads. If you enjoy finding new ways to use your Smart Phone, Laptop, iPad, or similar device then you might like the new Tech class. Do you enjoy using your GPS? GPS units are allowed in all classes and can be helpful to identify the roads you encounter. Maybe you like to solve puzzles, then a Course Rally might be for you (see below). Do you enjoy meeting new friends and discussing the event at the finish with food and drink (see below too). And of course, maybe you'll win an award!

What's new for 2012? The Tech Class. Do you want to use your Smart Phone, Laptop, iPad, etc. to determine if you're early or late? Then the tech class might be for you. Go to SJR's website to see where you can find APPs, spreadsheets, etc. to help you run in this class. How do you use your Smart Phone to determine if you're early or late? There's an APP for that. The Richta APP is a popular APP for timekeeping.

The South Jersey Region (SJR) holds two types of TSD rallies. The first type is called a Tour Rally. On Tour rallies the route instructions are very straight forward and easy to follow. The biggest challenge of a Tour Rally is to stay on time. The second type is called a Course Rally. Do you like to play games? ...solve puzzles?...watch action mystery movies? Then you might prefer a Course Rally. Course rallies have an additional challenge. Course Rallies have some tricky instructions known as Traps. These instructions need to be interpreted correctly in order to arrive at the checkpoints on time. These Trap instructions add a second challenge to the event while still needing to stay on time. Most of SJRs rallies offer dual events containing both Tour Rally instructions and Course Rally instructions. Newcomers to rallying should enter the Tour rally in SOP Class.

At the conclusion of the rally everyone is invited to come into JG Cooks and join us as we enjoy the food and drink while swapping "war stories" and "outright lies" about the day's event. Awards will be presented as soon as the scores are totaled. Two TSD rallies in one: Course Rally with three classes of Equipped Tech, and Stock and **Touring Rally** with four classes of Equipped, Tech, Stock and Seat of Pants (SOP). **Both rallies will require you to use your GPS** (or map) to find an Intersection where each leg starts, then follow simple written instructions to the checkpoint. The **Course Rally will also feature a GPS Rule** to not turn on roads whose names begin with G, P, or S. Maps of Salem County will be available for \$5 if needed. **Trophies** will be presented in the manner described in the Standard General Instructions in the two rallies. SCCA points will be by separate classes. **Year End Awards** will be presented in the three Course rally classes and the four Touring Rally Classes. **Special Awards** Form your own competition group such as Best Chevy Entrant, Best John's Sunoco Employee, Best Friends, Best NE Rally Club Member, Best Smith Family Member, or any common bond that you have. We only require 2 prepaid entries at least one week before the rally. Then we will get the set of trophies and have them for you at the rally. Special Awards are in addition to the other awards.
